2. Student Leadership Conference - Dan Fergueson

Introduction of creating a SLC Conference Task Force to focus on the purpose and mission of the SLC. This task force will be utilizing surveys to students/staff to garner feedback to help envision the future of SLC. The SLC TF will help to envision/define the "why" and then produce a conference that fulfills that why, knowing there are different "why's" for folks across the state. Intentional reach out to schools that don't historically attend.

Open Comments:

- Wasn't able to attend as a student. First opportunity would have been this year. Intrigued, excited, heard great things from students & staff.
- Students enjoy the travel aspect. Prefers the west side for that. Also the opportunity to see that they are a part of something larger. Shared connection is hard to achieve in a virtual environment.
- Biggest takeaway students have is a van ride. Rare opportunity for them to meet other CC students in similar programs but it becomes harder to justify when the students biggest takeaway is the van ride. Also, the challenge of who to bring. Ex: Graphic design students have one session dedicated to them. It's ok to not be everything to everybody. Would like to see us do one thing well.
- Our job as advisors is to help them understand how this conference fits into their professional/personal development. Leadership skills are needed for all of them.
- Knowing the content early can be helpful so topics aren't discussed ahead of time.
- The bonding is so important to a cohesive team.
- We have to meet the students where they are at. Providing foundational support skills for learning what leadership is and how it comes to life in your daily experience in small meaningful ways that lead to big ways. Virtually, we have been having very basic conversations such as "what does it mean to hold space?" and basic conversations around inclusivity and language.
- Little things matter. Van rides, group settings mean something to the students. Remembering and acknowledging those experiences, and possibly trying to create them is going to be important for the student experience. Lollipop leadership!
- COVID has given us an opportunity to examine the future of the conference for when we are providing an in-person conference.
- Providing foundational leadership concepts for our students.
- Task force formed open to all. Come for one meeting, come for all.
